INTRODUCTION TO BIBLICAL GREEK FALL 2016 - Syllabus

I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is a study of the basic morphology (form) and syntax (function) of New Testament Greek for students who have not had any Greek instruction.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES

- a. Students will be able pronounce (sound out) any Greek word.
- b. Students will be able to recognize some of the basic and common forms of nouns, verbs, and adjectives, and pronouns.
- c. Students will be able to parse Present, Future, or Imperfect Indicative verbs.
- d. Students will be able to translate simple Greek sentences.

V. CLASS STRUCTURE

VI. COURSE REQUIREMENTS

a. Homework

There will be 3 sections of homework each week. (1) memorization (2) reading (3) workbook exercises. See Assignment schedule below for breakdown.

Expect to do 15-20 minutes of homework PER DAY, 5 days a week. That's what's required to learn the language well. It just takes time and there's no way around it. To learn this material it will likely mean giving up a little free time.

b. Quizzes and Tests

Each week there will be a review quiz covering any material from previous weeks. There will be 2 exams: a mid-term, and a final. They will be take-home, open-note, closed book exams. These are purely for your edification. Tests keep us accountable and show us what we learned in a clear and measurable way. It's up to you how seriously you take them.

c. Payment

This course costs \$50.00, due on the final class period, but the fee will be waived if two requirements are met: (1) you attend at least 75% of the lessons and (2) show that you're trying your best [i.e. doing *something* on the homework, making an effort to memorize, etc.] Do those two things, and I'll cover the cost. If not, you owe me \$50 for my time and books. © You'll sign a statement at the bottom of this syllabus.
